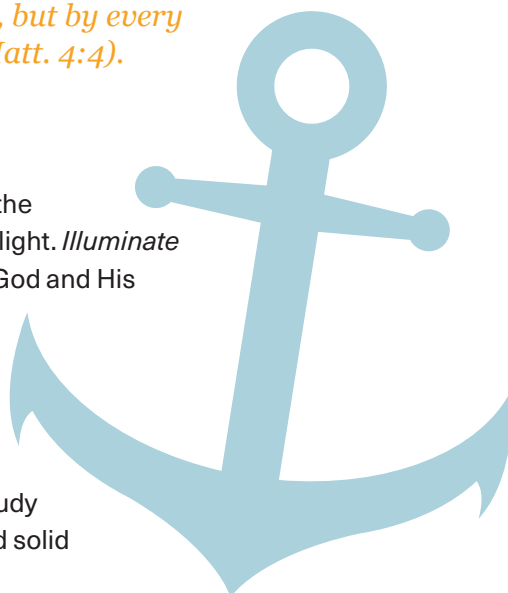
The Most Important Class of the Day!

Science, math, and spelling are necessary and valuable topics of study, but nothing can surpass the value of consistent time devoted to learning God's Word. Numerous studies paint a painful picture of the state of biblical literacy and Christian conduct among “churched” teens and college students. “Good kids” who attend church regularly all their lives for some reason are reaching college with minimal knowledge of Bible basics, having no serious interest in Bible study or prayer, and lacking the spiritual discipline to live in accordance with biblical truth. If Scripture truly is the only source for authoritative truth, then our students need to study it and know it well. No other study or pursuit of knowledge can have the eternal impact that Bible study does. It should never be ignored or treated as a matter of secondary importance.

Going Deep

Some scriptural truths seem simple on the surface, and yet the deeper you explore, the more spiritual riches are brought to light. *Illuminate Bible Series* is intended to help children think deeply about God and His Word. The number of Bible learning aids available for kids today is enormous. Yet, on average, children and teens today manifestly know less about the Bible than children and teens a generation ago. The best way to combat this uncomfortable reality is to draw kids into meaningful engagement with Scripture. Our robust, kid-friendly Bible study materials help children wrestle with vital Bible teachings and solid doctrine.



How Does the *Illuminate Bible Series* Work?

Learning Together

Our teaching guide contains colorful graphics and eye-catching designs. This makes it an easy curriculum to be displayed on a screen or read like a storybook to help hold your students' attention.

Every weekly lesson includes five half-hour steps. You may choose to teach one step for each day of the school week or combine steps if you have fewer than five days of Bible class in a week. A Bible passage is provided every day to be read aloud together at the start of each step. The weekly memory verse can also be reviewed together throughout the week as you see fit.

A Typical Day

Here is a simple outline of how each step is designed to work.

- **Bible**—Read the Scripture text for the day.
- **Daily Step**—Remind students of the Step 1 Bible story, then read the *Guide Book* step together. Depending on your students' reading level, you may want to have them read the step themselves.
- **Prayer Point**—Pray together using the *Prayer Point*, which connects with some aspect of the daily step.

Prayer Point

Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with joy in knowing Jesus.
- **Christ Focus**—Read the *Christ Focus* and encourage thinking about how the Scripture passage and step point to Jesus and the gospel.

Christ Focus

Jesus is still causing joy two thousand years later. We are blessed that He came into the world.
- **Student Workbooks**—Let the students answer the questions and do the activities in their workbooks.
- **Activity**—Pick one day during the week for students to do the weekly activity. These crafts provide an option to mix things up and engage students with the lesson topic in a more hands-on way.

How to Use the *5th-6th Grade Guide Book*

This *5th-6th Grade Guide Book* is the teaching manual that can be used to teach children in 5th through 6th grade. It is a two-semester study that includes 8 units spread over 32 weekly lessons. It also includes a seasonal unit (see page 12).

Each lesson of the *5th-6th Grade Guide Book* focuses on a prominent **Bible story** to be read with the first step. The next four steps provide **supplemental passages** and different perspectives that encourage a deeper understanding of the main Bible story in light of other Scripture truths.



DISCOVER (Step 1): a thought-provoking treatment of elements within *the featured Bible story*



INVESTIGATE (Step 2): noteworthy information about the featured story's *context and background*



CONNECT (Step 3): significant connections between the featured Bible story and other *related Scriptures and biblical concepts*



FOCUS (Step 4): a kid-friendly discussion of *doctrinal truth* related to the featured Bible story



ILLUMINATE (Step 5): a *review* of the lesson's steps and meaningful ways to *put truth into practice*

5th-6th Grade Guide Book Extras!

Each lesson is packed not only with Bible-rich content but also additional rewarding insights and helpful learning aids.

- **Focal Point** pages supply extra material related to the weekly passage and include anything from archaeology and world cultures to geography and missions emphases. These topics can be discussed throughout the week as you see fit.
- **Callout boxes** offer unique and valuable ideas to consider that aid in understanding the lesson.
- Important **vocabulary words** in these lessons are highlighted and reviewed at the end of every week. Definitions are in the glossary at the back of this book and the student workbook.

What's in a name? Most names have some kind of story behind them. Some people are named after a relative, friend, or celebrity. Other people's names have special meaning. Some parents just like the sound of a name. The prophet John had an especially unique backstory to his name. It was chosen by God. Then it was announced by an angel!

The angel Gabriel had first announced Elizabeth's pregnancy in Luke 1:13. He told Zechariah to name the baby John. But Zechariah thought he and Elizabeth were too old to have a baby. Because of his unbelief, Gabriel made him unable to speak until his son was born.

Picking names. That's where today's story picks up. Zechariah chose to believe what Gabriel said and obey what he said to do. When asked for the baby's name, Zechariah wrote "John" on a writing tablet. Instantly, he could speak again, and he was filled with joy and thankfulness to God.

The first thing Zechariah did when he could speak was praise God. He burst into praise for God's faithfulness (vss. 67-75). He linked what God was doing to what He had promised thousands of years ago (Ps. 105:8). Believers today can follow Zechariah's example by remembering all God has done and thank Him for it. Psalm 105's instructions are clear: praise the Lord. Doing so will help people want to talk to God, ask for His help, and tell others about Him.

Zechariah's praise caused everyone in the room to wonder at what God was going to do with this baby's life. Everyone around knew that Zechariah and Elizabeth were too old to have children. They knew that Zechariah lost his voice when he didn't believe God. Now they heard him speak again! Seeing these miracles amazed all the people nearby. They all wondered what John would grow up to be.

Praising the name of God. Through the Holy Spirit, Zechariah knew that John would fill a special role. John would be a **prophet** to get the people ready for the Messiah, the promised King for whom they had been waiting. Zechariah went on to tell them how the Messiah would save them. He would forgive them and deliver them from their sins (Luke 1:76-79). Let us learn from Zechariah. When God helps us understand His wonderful truths in the Bible, our job is to believe, praise, and thank Him.

God is glorified when His people thank and praise Him. That is as easy as saying "Thank You" and telling others what He has done. Just like Hannah and Mary, we shouldn't take credit for the good things in our lives. We should give God credit and thanks for what He has done.

In Luke 3, John had a crowd following him from early on. And no wonder! Look at all the signs and miracles surrounding his birth! People were naturally curious about what John would do. It turned out that John wasn't the one who came to bring salvation—Jesus was! The purpose of John's ministry was to point people to Jesus.

Summarize

Use an activity from pages 499-500 to summarize the lesson together.

Prayer Point

Remember the promises God has kept, and thank Him for them.

Christ Focus

Over a thousand years of prophecies and promises were made about Jesus. Now He was finally coming into the world (see Acts 3:22-26).

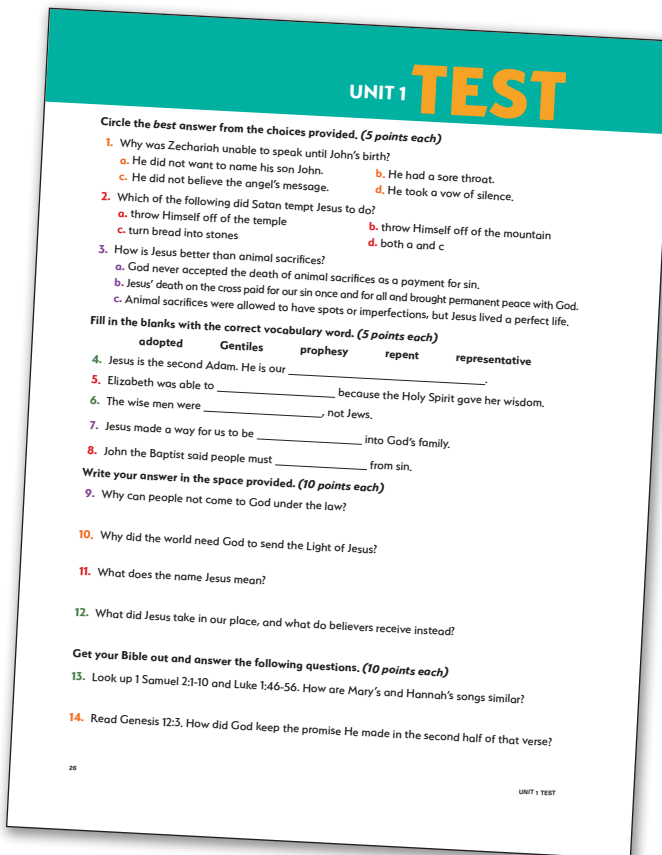
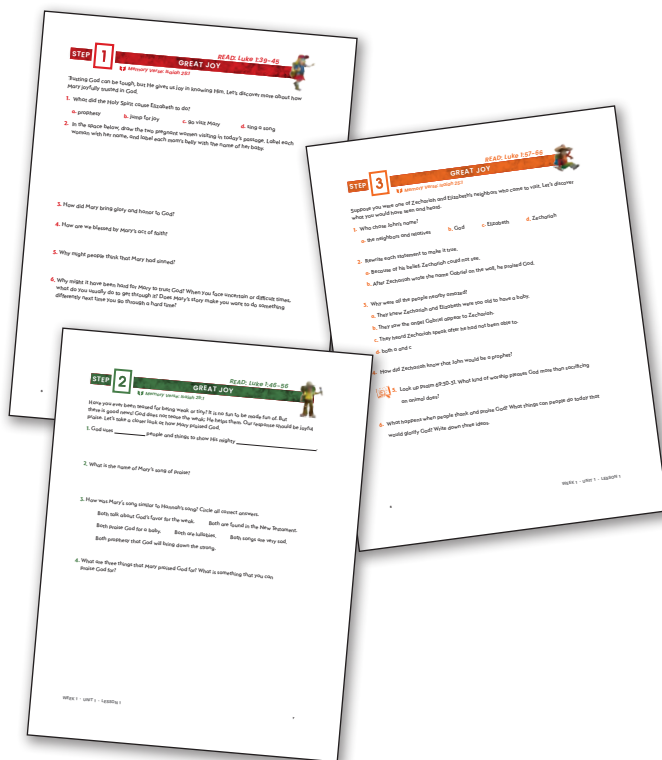


Flexibility!

Because this curriculum has been designed with various classroom models in mind, flexibility is built in. If there is a need to reduce this to a four- or even three-day course, steps of your choice can be combined or skipped. The **tests are coded** so that any questions about material students have not studied can be excluded from their grade. (Each test is worth a total of 100 points; simply deduct from this original number any points related to the skipped material to establish a new starting total.)

The **ILLUMINATE** step (Step 5) in the *5th-6th Grade Guide Book* provides **review questions** for each daily step as well as a get-up-and-go **application activity** to wrap up the week of study. You may find it best for your students to finish each day by quizzing them with these review questions, giving you more flexibility for the last day of your school week.

As you can see, your students can develop a deeper understanding of Scripture on a schedule you choose, and the curriculum can be adapted to fit your plans.



The Logic of the Scope & Sequence

There are a couple of common pitfalls regarding God's Word that we wanted to avoid in creating our overall plan for the *Illuminate Bible Series*:

Pitfall #1: seeing the Bible as merely a collection of heroic stories, miracles, and principles

Pitfall #2: treating the Bible primarily as a history book by using a strictly chronological approach

We believe the best way to teach the Bible to children is through a careful presentation of its central message—the story of God's grace and glory, which is ultimately expressed in Jesus Christ—through deep engagement with individual Scripture passages.

Realities to Remember

- God is at the center of the Bible. He superintended and empowered the exciting lives of the people in the Bible.
- Each book of the Bible is tied to the great central theme of God's grace and glory, even though we seek to understand each book in its historical context.
- Seeing Jesus is essential. Instead of wading through several years of chronological studies to finally get to Jesus, He is featured prominently in every year of study.

What Is the Plan?

Every year of the curriculum highlights an important attribute of God, using the stories of Scripture to place Him at the center of all things while continually highlighting the work and Person of Jesus.

1. **God Our Savior**—an exploration of God's work of salvation
2. **Our Faithful God**—a focus on God as One who keeps His promises
3. **Our God of Mercy and Grace**—a study of the wonderful mercy and grace God shows His people
4. **Prophets, Priests, and Kings**—a discussion of how the Old Testament points to Jesus
5. **Jesus, God's Son**—a survey of how Jesus is fully God
6. **God Will Triumph**—a review of how God prevails for all eternity

But I Want a Chronological Study!

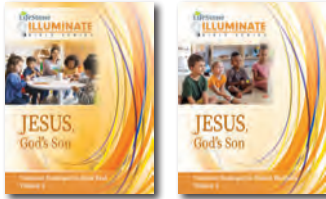
Every year is designed to thoroughly explore passages from all major sections of the Bible. **God Our Savior**, for example, shows how God has redeemed His people. God's work of salvation is traced from Genesis to Revelation as students see how He is carrying out His plan for creation. Notice that the individual units progress chronologically while connecting to the grand story of Scripture:

1. CREATION (Garden of Eden)
2. FALL (Adam and Eve, Sodom and Gomorrah, Tower of Babel, Noah)
3. REDEMPTION (God's deliverance of the Israelites and Jesus' life, death, and resurrection)
4. RESTORATION (God's final victory and believers' glorious future)

Though each year is not fully chronological, many of the units are structured chronologically. So, far from ignoring the chronology of Scripture, we believe it is helpful for students to see the central themes of Scripture as collections of stories that are to be explored. This approach will equip students to understand not just the academic content and historical facts of the Bible, but also how to interpret and apply every passage of Scripture for themselves.

Seasonal Unit Overview

What Is the Seasonal Unit?

Illuminate's scope and sequence is designed to explore themes in Scripture that point to God's character. Because academic calendars vary from year to year, important religious holidays are not built into the regular sequence of lessons. Rather, we have included a supplemental unit in the back of this book and your students' workbooks to observe religious holidays and key events. This seasonal unit contains four weeks of content to be used at your discretion throughout the school year.

How to Use

Every lesson in the seasonal unit functions like an ordinary lesson of *Illuminate*. When you choose to do a lesson from this unit, read the daily Scripture from the appropriate step first, then read the step's article. Students should complete any questions or activities given in their workbooks. The seasonal unit does not have a test.

Seasonal lessons are designed to be completed a week or two at a time, not all at once. When you are ready to use a lesson from the seasonal unit, pause your regular study until the lesson is completed. Resume your regular study the following week.

Seasonal Unit Content

Christmas | 1 lesson

We suggest using this lesson the last week of school before Christmas. Pause your regular study for a week to explore and appreciate the story of Jesus' advent. The lessons and activities will help your students focus their minds and hearts on Jesus during this season.

Resurrection | 2 lessons

We suggest using these lessons during the two weeks preceding Easter. These lessons focus on the crucifixion and Jesus' sacrifice as well as the joy of the resurrection and new life in Christ.

Second Coming of Christ | 1 lesson

This lesson can go anywhere in the year, but we suggest placing it sometime after Easter. It may also be paired with the Christmas lesson to talk about Christ's first and second comings back-to-back. Use this lesson to remind your students that Jesus will return to rule and reign forever.

PLAN FOR THE YEAR

Jesus, God's Son

How poetic that we (in the northern hemisphere, at least) celebrate the arrival of Jesus, the “Light of the World,” during the darkest days of the year! In humanity’s darkest moments, separated from God by sin, there appeared the long-awaited Savior, Jesus. He stepped into the world as Immanuel, meaning “God with us,” and turned everything upside down.

From the angel Gabriel’s announcement of Jesus’ coming (Luke 1:29-30) to baby John the Baptist jumping for joy in Elizabeth’s womb when Mary visited (vs. 41), Jesus’ role as the chosen Savior was clear even before His birth. John the Baptist, the Elijah-like prophet foretold in the Old Testament, prepared the way for Jesus’ earthly ministry (Mal. 4:5-6; John 1:19-23). After John baptized Jesus, Jesus spent time in the wilderness being tempted by Satan, but He never once gave in. The Savior had come, and He was perfect and sinless.

Many signs and events confirmed Jesus’ identity as the Son of God. Jesus Himself claimed to be God on several occasions, much to the chagrin of the Jewish religious leaders (John 10:22-39). His disciples confessed that He is the Son of God (Matt. 16:15-16). God the Father Himself declared Jesus’ divinity by transfiguring Him on a mountain (Mark 9:2-8).

Jesus also showed His divine power and authority by His actions. He calmed a storm, proving His power over nature. He cast out evil spirits, displaying His authority over enemy spiritual powers. He showed His authority over the Mosaic Law, throwing out the Pharisees’ extra rules and explaining God’s heart (Matt. 12:1-14). He even showed His power over life and death by raising Lazarus from the dead.

The amazing power of Jesus, God-with-us, became even more apparent after He rose from the dead. Jesus revealed how the whole of Scripture pointed to His coming. After forty days, He returned to His Father, but not without giving His disciples a critical mission: to make more disciples. Even though Jesus returned to the Father, He did not leave His people alone. He sent the Holy Spirit to live in them and to guide and direct them in their mission. Peter and the other disciples saw the power of the Holy Spirit firsthand when many came to Christ during the Jewish festival of Pentecost (Acts 2:41).

The Holy Spirit’s power also became evident through the early church’s unusual generosity, even during times of great persecution. Further, the apostles showed that this power came from Jesus when they healed the sick in His name (3:1-10). Jesus also appeared to the apostle Paul in visions, guiding and encouraging him in his missionary journeys. Though Jesus was no longer physically on earth, His presence was still evident.

Jesus is alive today, reigning in heaven at the right hand of the Father. His name is still mighty, and His church continues to grow and spread, fulfilling the Great Commission until He returns. Until then, His followers live in His presence and grow closer in relationship with Him, knowing that each moment of their lives brings them closer to knowing and seeing Him as He truly is.



Semester 1: Son of God

In these four units, we see how Jesus showed by His actions and His teachings who He really is:
God's promised Messiah and the Lord of all.

UNIT 1

THE COMING MESSIAH

The promise of Jesus' coming brought great joy to many people, who responded by praising God for His glory and goodness. Jesus' birth in Bethlehem attracted a number of visitors, including some dangerous enemies. Years later, John the Baptist urged people to listen to Jesus and believe in Him, and Jesus fended off temptations by Satan. That introduced Him as the powerful Messiah!





Memory Verse: Isaiah 25:1

What makes you feel happy?

A bundle of joy. You want to celebrate your birthday with friends. You want to show off your new toy or gadget. You want to tell someone when you've just had the best ice cream ever. We love to share our joy with other people! In today's passage, Mary was filled with joy. She had so much joy that she wanted to share it! Mary was going to have a baby, and this baby was a miracle! He would not be any ordinary child. He was the Son of God, and His name was Jesus.



Mary had great joy in what God was doing even though her pregnancy was not a normal story. She was not married when she became pregnant. Some people may have tried to make her feel bad about that because normally it would have meant Mary had sinned. It may have been a struggle to be joyful when she didn't know what would happen. But Mary knew that her baby was from God. She trusted God to take care of her. Because Mary trusted God, she celebrated her child. Her joy in spite of other people's rejection brought honor and glory to God.

Mary shared her joy with her relative Elizabeth. Elizabeth was going to have a baby too. Her pregnancy was also a miracle. Elizabeth was very old, and she thought she was too old to have children. But God gave Elizabeth a baby. Her baby would be Jesus' relative John the Baptist. John would later prepare the way for Jesus' ministry.

When Mary found out that Elizabeth was pregnant, she made the long trip to Elizabeth's house. Elizabeth lived seventy miles away. Mary probably had to walk the whole way there, which would have taken several days.

Jumping for joy. Do people ever tell you to stop bouncing off the walls? Unless you have your own personal bounce house, they probably mean you are acting too excited and need to calm down. But Mary's pregnancy was a very good reason to be excited. Elizabeth was full of joy when she saw Mary. Even the baby inside her celebrated! The Holy Spirit made the baby recognize who Mary was. He leapt with joy! Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit caused Elizabeth to **prophesy**. God gave her wisdom about Mary and her baby. God's presence was bringing great joy! Soon even more people would get to be in God's presence because Jesus, who is God, would live and walk among them.

Elizabeth said that Mary was blessed because she believed in God. She trusted God to keep His promises. This blessing would spread to other people. People would see what God had done in Mary's life. They would see the blessing she had received. Today, Mary is still remembered for her role as Jesus' mother. And because God used her in that way, we can have the joy of knowing Jesus.

God chose Mary. She trusted Him and believed His promises. We are still blessed by her act of faith. She trusted God and gave birth to the Savior of the world.

Summarize

Use an activity from pages 499-500 to summarize the lesson together.

Prayer Point

Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with joy in knowing Jesus.

Christ Focus

Jesus is still causing joy two thousand years later. We are blessed that He came into the world.

Head for the Hills!

You shouldn't make mountains out of molehills, but some hills of the "hill country" really were cliffs (Luke 1:39). The cliffs made a natural barrier that protected the area. It is hard to attack a place protected by mountains. That means Elizabeth lived in a safe area.

The hill country was part of Judah, in the south of Israel. Mary was from Galilee, to the north (see vss. 26-27). Her trip brought her from the lower grounds of the north to the southern hills. Scholars believe that she traveled about eighty to one hundred miles. It probably took between three and five days.

Hoppin' John

Did you know that babies that have been growing for six months are about as long as an ear of corn? They weigh between one and two pounds. Their ears are finished developing, so the babies respond to sounds they hear by moving around. The Bible says Elizabeth was six months pregnant when Mary came to visit (Luke 1:36-40). Elizabeth's baby, John, may have only been as tall as an ear of corn, but his ears sure were working! His little ears heard Mary greet his mom. Then he jumped for joy because Jesus was nearby. Jesus was even smaller than John was then. Even so, He was already the greatest visitor ever.

FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT

What did you do before you were born? Probably not much. An angel said John would be filled with the Holy Spirit before being born (Luke 1:15). During Mary's visit, Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit (vs. 41). Maybe that was when John was filled too! Now God sends His Spirit to believers. But before Jesus went back to heaven, that did not happen (John 7:39). Sometimes God sent His Spirit to people in the Old Testament. Most were important leaders, such as judges and prophets. The Holy Spirit prepared them for special jobs or gave them God's words to speak. Check out the chart for some examples.

GREAT JOY

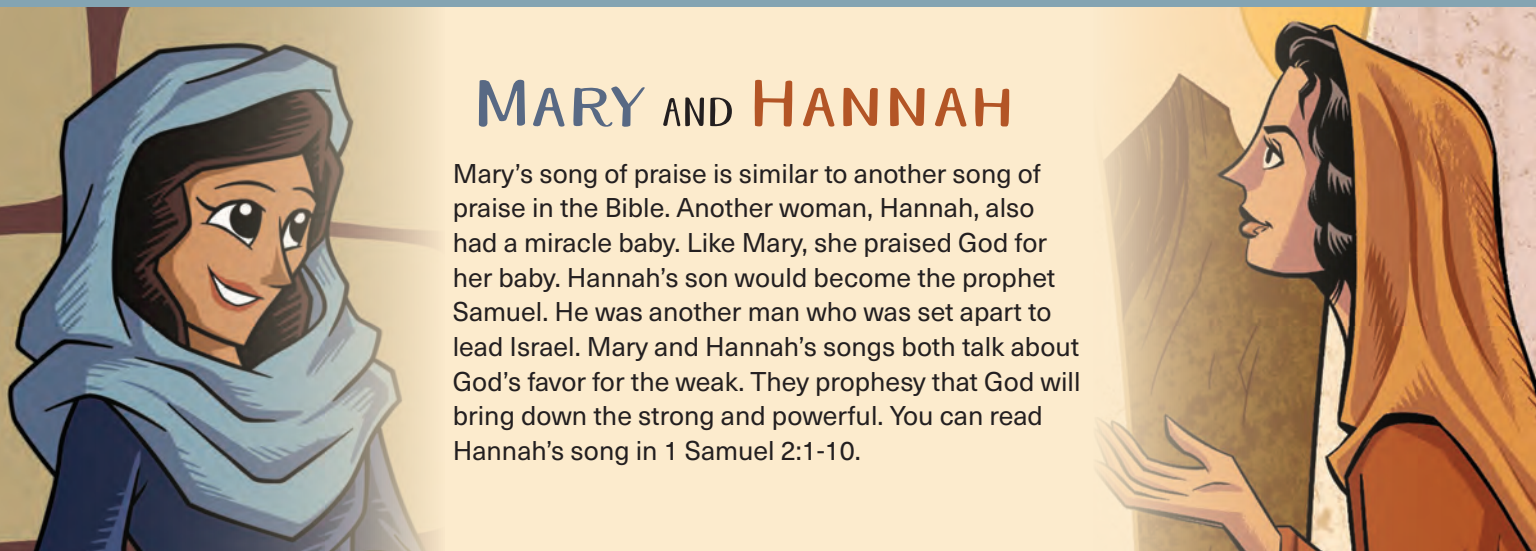
 Memory Verse: Isaiah 25:1

On March 16, 2018, an underdog made basketball history. The worst team in the March Madness tournament was matched up against the best team. But this time, they won! For the first time in tournament history, the worst team beat the best team. They won by twenty points, with a final score of seventy-four to fifty-four.

Most of us love underdog stories. We love to see the least and the weakest beat the best and the strongest. We like to believe that it could happen for us. Mary's song of praise in Luke 1 teaches us that God loves an underdog too. God uses weak people and things to show His mighty power.



After Mary and Elizabeth's meeting, Mary sang a song of praise. This song is called the Magnificat. "Magnificat" is the Latin word of the first word in the song: "magnify." Churches throughout history have put these Spirit-filled words to music. This beautiful song praises God for all He has done.



MARY AND HANNAH

Mary's song of praise is similar to another song of praise in the Bible. Another woman, Hannah, also had a miracle baby. Like Mary, she praised God for her baby. Hannah's son would become the prophet Samuel. He was another man who was set apart to lead Israel. Mary and Hannah's songs both talk about God's favor for the weak. They prophesy that God will bring down the strong and powerful. You can read Hannah's song in 1 Samuel 2:1-10.



The Coming Messiah

Mary realized the importance of the baby she was carrying. In her song, she praised God for helping and remembering Israel. She rejoiced that He was doing mighty things. She thanked God for using Jesus to bring down the proud and mighty. She knew her baby was not just any baby. She knew Jesus is the Messiah her people were waiting for.

STRENGTH in *Weakness*

Believers often think that God will work out His great plans if Christians could just get enough power. They think God will do great things if their churches get big enough. They believe God will be glorified if Christians have enough fame. But Mary's song reminds us that God works through the weak and powerless. He actually throws down people in high positions. When God uses someone weak for His plans, He shows off His great strength and is glorified!

ECHOES OF THE PAST

Mary's song is rich in Old Testament ideas. She quoted from verses and ideas in the Bible from the Prophets and the Psalms. She used Scripture that was deep in her heart to praise God.

Prayer Point

Thank God for choosing to use weak people to do His will.

Christ Focus

Though Jesus came into the world as a baby, He would one day show He is more powerful than the most rich and royal people.



Have you ever been teased for being weak or tiny? It is no fun to be made fun of. But there is good news! God does not tease the weak; He helps them. Our response should be joyful praise. Let's take a closer look at how Mary praised God.

**Scripture Connections:** 1 Sam. 2:1-8; Ps. 105; Luke 1:57-79

What's in a name? Most names have some kind of story behind them. Some people are named after a relative, friend, or celebrity. Other people's names have special meaning. Some parents just like the sound of a name. The prophet John had an especially unique backstory to his name. It was chosen by God. Then it was announced by an angel!

The angel Gabriel had first announced Elizabeth's pregnancy in Luke 1:13. He told Zechariah to name the baby John. But Zechariah thought he and Elizabeth were too old to have a baby. Because of his unbelief, Gabriel made him unable to speak until his son was born.

Picking names. That's where today's story picks up. Zechariah chose to believe what Gabriel said and obey what he said to do. When asked for the baby's name, Zechariah wrote "John" on a writing tablet. Instantly, he could speak again, and he was filled with joy and thankfulness to God.

The first thing Zechariah did when he could speak was praise God. He burst into praise for God's faithfulness (vss. 67-75). He linked what God was doing to what He had promised thousands of years ago (Ps. 105:8). Believers today can follow Zechariah's example by remembering all God has done and thank Him for it. Psalm 105's instructions are clear: praise the Lord. Doing so will help people want to talk to God, ask for His help, and tell others about Him.

Zechariah's praise caused everyone in the room to wonder at what God was going to do with this baby's life. Everyone around knew that Zechariah and Elizabeth were too old to have children. They knew that Zechariah lost his voice when he didn't believe God. Now they heard him speak again! Seeing these miracles amazed all the people nearby. They all wondered what John would grow up to be.

Praising the name of God. Through the Holy Spirit, Zechariah knew that John would fill a special role. John would be a **prophet** to get the people ready for the Messiah, the promised King for whom they had been waiting. Zechariah went on to tell them how the Messiah would save them. He would forgive them and deliver them from their sins (Luke 1:76-79). Let us learn from Zechariah. When God helps us understand His wonderful truths in the Bible, our job is to believe, praise, and thank Him.

God is glorified when His people thank and praise Him. That is as easy as saying "Thank You" and telling others what He has done. Just like Hannah and Mary, we shouldn't take credit for the good things in our lives. We should give God credit and thanks for what He has done.

In Luke 3, John had a crowd following him from early on. And no wonder! Look at all the signs and miracles surrounding his birth! People were naturally curious about what John would do. It turned out that John wasn't the one who came to bring salvation—Jesus was! The purpose of John's ministry was to point people to Jesus.

Christ Focus

**Doctrine:** Focusing on God

No, thanks! A very famous Hollywood actor once said that he wished everyone could try being rich and famous so that they would see that it's not all that great! That's pretty shocking to hear from a big movie star, but it's true. Being rich and famous doesn't make us happy. In fact, many famous people have experienced the downside of fame.

We humans are not meant to have all the attention on us. Instead, we're made to live for something bigger. Psalm 113 shows us that we are meant to serve, praise, and love God. It teaches us that God alone is strong enough to help us with all our struggles. He works through His people to accomplish His purposes.

Thanks be to God! This week we've been looking at the announcement of Jesus' birth. These announcements brought joy, thanks, and praise to God. Mary and her relatives saw what God was doing through Jesus' birth. He was changing the order of things. He was lifting up the humble and lowly (like Mary). He was bringing down the powerful. Zechariah realized that God was showing mercy by sending the Messiah. Hundreds of years before Mary's and Zechariah's songs of thanks and praise, Psalm 113 gave a similar message. It gives us a few reasons to thank God, praise Him, and keep Him as our focus:

1. We are His servants. We were never made to live for ourselves, doing whatever we want to do. We were made to live for God, doing what He wants us to do. He created the world, and He's in charge of it. As His humble servants, we ought to follow Him as our loving Master.
2. All kinds of people from all nations praise God, and so should we! God doesn't only save one kind of people. He saves all kinds of people through the gospel. That means there are Christians who worship God in places around the world that you've never heard of. One day, all God's people will be gathered and will praise God for eternity. For now, believers are called to sing praises to God along with the rest of His creation.
3. God is King over the whole universe. He doesn't have to love the people He created, but He does. He wants to be involved in every part of our lives. God showed His love for us by sending Jesus to earth as a man. Through Jesus, people can have a close relationship with God, who created them.
4. God turns the expectations of the world upside down. He lifts up the poor and needy so that they have just as much respect as princes. As Elizabeth and Hannah both learned, He even gives children to childless women. When we praise God, we praise One who humbles the proud and helps the humble.

Psalm 66:4 says that all creation sings praises to God. Science can show how this is literally true, both with animals and in space! There is a black hole that plays a note fifty-seven octaves below middle C. Whales sing, and some frogs hum notes to resonate with their tree holes.

Christ Focus
