## HOW TO USE YOUR WORKBOOK

The questions and activities in this workbook are designed to be completed after each *Preschool-Kindergarten Guide Book* lesson.

This *Preschool-Kindergarten Student Workbook* is intentionally flexible to be used in a variety of homeschool and classroom settings. Weekly stories, activity instructions, and review questions are included in this book. This workbook allows you to work with your student one-on-one to assess his or her individual learning. In a classroom setting, completed pages can be sent home at the end of a lesson or unit to include family members in their student's learning journey.



**Awesome Bible stories.** Each week starts with a Bible story to help students learn about God. You can revisit the story together throughout the week and reinforce it with a related coloring page at the end.



**Talk about it.** Steps 1-4 include questions to review key people and events from the Bible story and reinforce the lesson's main ideas. These questions give students opportunities to display their knowledge and help teachers identify concepts that may need further review.



**Scripture memory.** Each step offers a suggestion for memorizing a Bible verse related to the lesson theme. Daily review helps students remember and internalize these important truths.



**Fun activities!** Each step includes a fun activity or coloring page to keep students' hands and minds engaged. These activities reinforce concepts from the lesson and make learning fun!





## SOMEONE IS COMING

**Knock, knock.** When someone knocks on your door, do you try to guess who it is? It would be exciting to have someone special stop by!

Mary had a special visitor. It was an angel! Angels work for God. The angel came to tell her something very exciting. She would have a baby by God's power. The angel said it would be a miracle. A miracle is something that can't happen unless God does it.

Mary was surprised, but she said, "I am God's servant. May it happen the way you said."

Do you know who Mary's baby was going to be?



**Who's there?** After the angel left, Mary hurried to visit her family member named Elizabeth. Elizabeth was going to have a miracle baby too! Even though she was very old, God promised her a baby. God had a special plan for Elizabeth's baby. The baby would be named John. When he grew up, he would work for God as a prophet. God would speak to people through him.

When Mary said hello to Elizabeth, baby John jumped for joy inside Elizabeth's tummy. He wasn't born yet, but he knew who the baby in Mary's tummy was. That made baby John want to celebrate.

Elizabeth knew who the baby was too. "You and your baby are blessed," she said. "Blessed" means God has done a good thing for someone.

Mary hadn't told them about her baby yet, but baby John and Elizabeth knew who her baby was. Were they super smart? Maybe, but that's not how they knew. They knew because of God the Holy Spirit. God the Holy Spirit knows everything. He told them who Mary's baby was. They didn't have to guess. They knew that the baby in Mary's tummy was the most special baby ever. That was why they were so happy.

**Jesus.** Elizabeth did not feel like she was good enough to have such a special visitor. "Why should God bless me with a visit from the mother of my Lord? Even my baby jumped for joy when you came. You are blessed for trusting that God would do what He said He would," she said.

God's angel had told Mary that her baby would be Jesus, the Son of God. Mary, Elizabeth, and John were full of joy because Mary's baby was Jesus Christ the Lord. What an important visitor! God Himself had come to visit His people. He had come to save them.

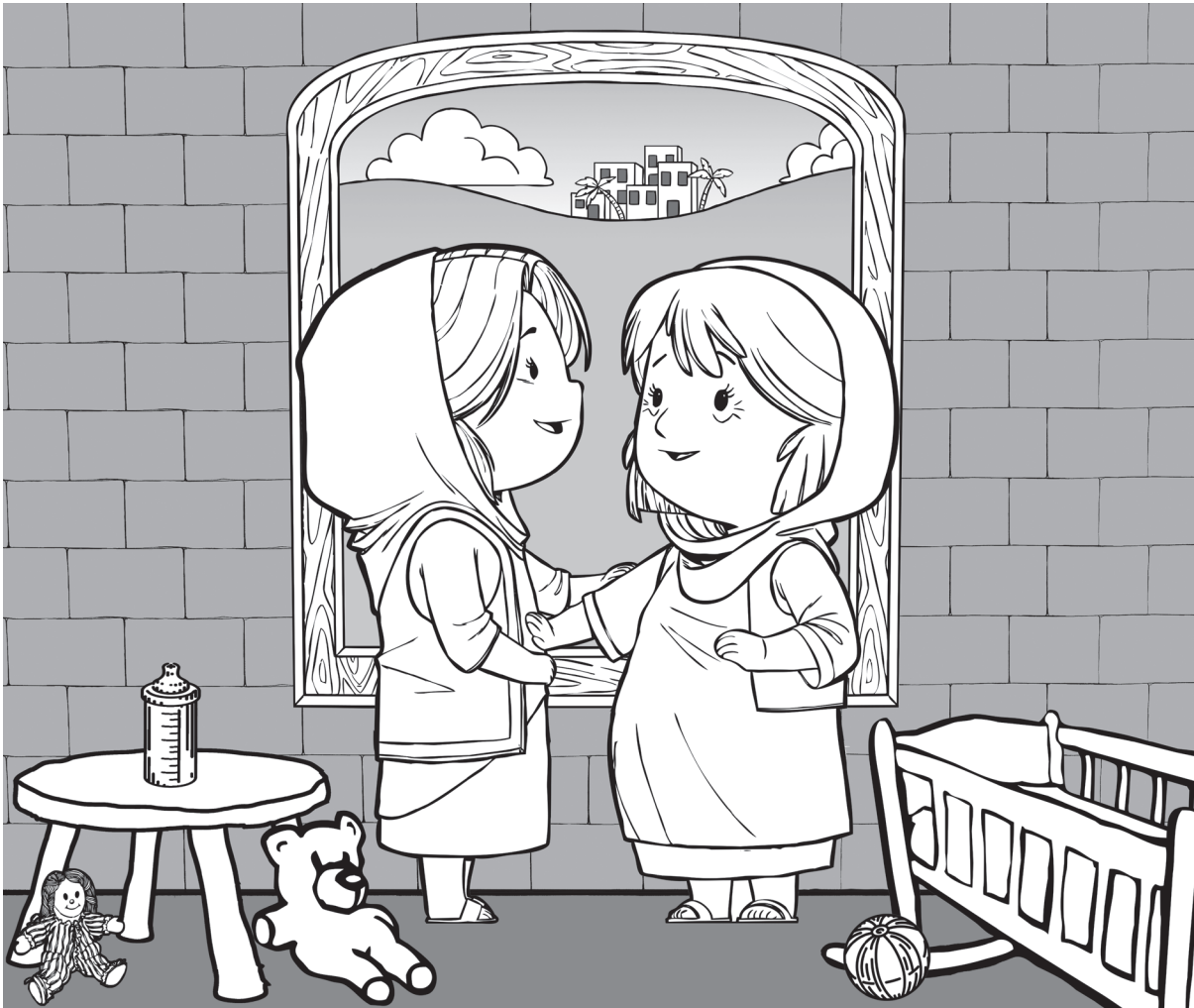

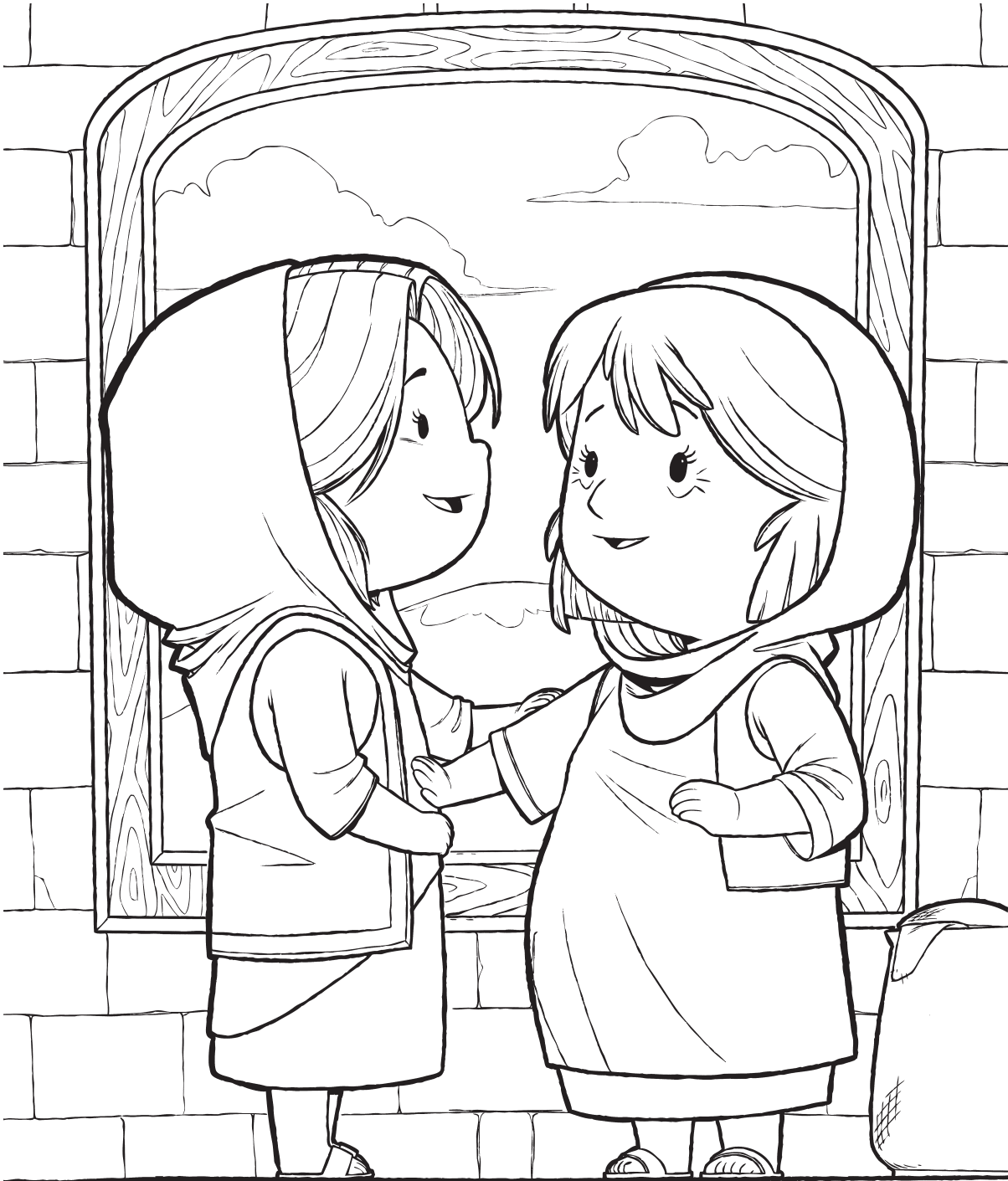
